Ahrens is donating 120 field bins to country football clubs in South Australia and Victoria, where its Sherwell operation is based.

According to Chairman of the SA Community Football Board, Mr David Shipway, this donation is the most valuable offer ever made to SA's country football clubs.

"This is an outstanding gesture by a truly community-minded company," David says.

"The fabric and culture of our country towns generally revolve around their local footy clubs, many of whom have suffered from poor agricultural seasons and declining populations. The field bins will be offered to the public via silent auction, with all proceeds going directly to the participating clubs.

"We are a fourth-generation family business and we are always looking for ways to give back to those who have contributed to our success," Stellan says.
